"From Violence to Peaceful Coexistence" in Hanoi



VIETNAM - On September 25, MenCare partner, the Center for Studies and Applied Sciences in Gender - Families - Women and Adolescents (<u>CSAGA</u>), organized a National Conference on the theme "From Violence to Peaceful Coexistence" in Hanoi, Vietnam.

The conference introduced tools and products specifically designed for

male perpetrators of domestic violence, and shared lessons learned and recommendations for working with male perpetrators of domestic violence more effectively. In pursuit of its mission of peace and non-violence, the conference put on display positive imagery of men and fathers.

With the participation of the Ministry of Culture, the Ministry of Labour, the Ministry of Public Security, the Ministry of Justice, the Vietnam Women's Union, the People's Supreme Court, Vietnam Television, there were over 200 representatives from seven provinces in Vietnam, hundreds men in general and fathers in particular.

'Fatherhood and Care' Occupies the Streets in Brazil

BRAZIL - The staff Instituto PAPAI through the program Diálogos para o Desenvolvimento Social de Suape (Dialogues for Social Development of Suape), in coordination with the campaign Paternidade e Cuidado também se Constroem (Fatherhood and Care can also be Built) aims to invite men to think



about how they can become more directly involved in caring for their children. In pursuit of this mission, they occupied the streets of Cabo de Santo Agostinho in a public act, distributing educational materials - brochures, pamphlets and posters.

Moreover dialogue circles are being held with men who are working on building the Abreu e Lima refinery, work of great social impact for the local community. Within the outreach work with these men, lectures are held in Dialogues Daily Safety (DDS); workshops with companies in construction sites or in lodgings. Besides the issue of care, these activities also address issues such as family planning, the experience of the process of pregnancy, right of paternity leave, among others.

World Day of Prayer and Action

GLOBAL - The World Day of Prayer and Action for Children is coming on November 20th.

What will you do to help end violence against children?

The World Day of Prayer and Action for Children, celebrated on Universal Children's Day, is an opportunity for all sectors of society – governments, intergovernmental organizations, non-governmental organizations and religious communities -- to accelerate and magnify global efforts to end violence against children. Its particular focus is to engage Religious Leaders and their communities to change the social norms that lead to violence.

"Secular or inter-faith organisations can really play an important role," said <u>Kul Chandra Gautam</u>, President of the World Day of Prayer and Action for Children at an event in Nepal in 2012. "Only a diamond can cut a diamond," he said to describe the importance of faith-based interventions to stop harmful traditional practices used in the name of religions. "Law enforcement alone is not sufficient to eliminate the traditional practices that cripple our society. It is essential to work with our religious leaders so that they can inform and influence our communities to change society."

To date, over 300 World Day activities have been mobilized in 88 countries, focused primarily on (a) protecting children through universal birth registration, (b) promoting positive parenting and non-violent discipline, and (c) ending child marriage.
